
## The Man Box

From a young age, boys are conditioned to fit inside a box and taught narrow definitions of masculinity. This concept is referred to as the "Man Box", a term coined by the national nonprofit A Call To Men. The Man Box puts great limits on male expression and behavior, requiring men to be strong, successful, powerful, dominating, fearless, in control, and emotionless. While healthy manhood includes valuing and respecting others, it also includes valuing oneself and living authentically.
